Psychologist Position (with responsibility for Internship Career Seminar)

Kansas State University invites applicants for a Staff Psychologist for a full -time, 12 month position. The successful applicant will be a generalist with a strong interest in working with a college population. This position also entails heading the career seminar for doctoral interns in our APA accredited internship program, supporting their teaching of the career-life planning course, training them in the use/interpretation of career explorations tools, and working closely with the internship Training Director and the Training Team. Additional job duties include the following: providing short term individual, couple, and group therapy; conducting initial assessments, intakes, and crisis sessions; providing referrals and bridging care to the community as needed; providing supervision and training for doctoral interns; consulting with students, faculty, and staff regarding mental health issues; participating in outreach activities to the campus community; and providing service to the campus community as requested by our Director. The position reports to the Director of the Counseling Services, which is a part of the Division of Student Life.

During the academic year when classes are in session, we are open Mondays and Thursdays from 8 a.m. - 7 p.m. and Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Staff work a day or evening schedule for a minimum of 40 hours per week. Occasional after hours and weekend work is required.

Minimum Qualifications/Requirements:

- Ph.D. or Psy.D. in Counseling or Clinical Psychology from an APA-accredited or equivalent educational program.
- License eligible in the state of Kansas. The successful candidate must be licensed in the state of Kansas and capable of independent practice within a negotiable timeframe.
- Experience in organizing and/or teaching a class, ideally at a college/university level.
- The successful applicant should also:
 - Be committed to a proactive student development perspective involving an active relationship with the campus community.
 - o Demonstrate a commitment to a developmental philosophy toward both clients and trainees.
 - Possess the ability to work cooperatively and collaboratively on an interdisciplinary team.
 - Be creative and flexible in response to developing demands and challenges of the position.
 - Have the ability to handle spontaneous work demands while undertaking projects that require advance planning.
 - Demonstrate proficiency in oral and written communication skills and leading group discussions.
 - Possess good, basic computer skills and have experience with electronic record-keeping.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Minimum of one year experience at a college or university counseling center.
- > Taught a course in career theory or career-life planning.
- > Completion of a course that included career theory and career development concepts.
- Experience with administering and interpreting career assessments (e.g., SCII, MBTI, etc.)
- Experience in providing supervision.
- > Completion of an APA-accredited internship.
