Attend care coordination meetings with psychiatrist and other counseling center staff. Report client information to psychiatrist. Share 24 hour on-call coverage for mental health emergencies; provide on-call back-up for the Sexual Assault Response Coordinator as needed. Consult with director and other staff on cases. Provide health promotion and prevention services and programming for the students of Colorado College in a wide variety of areas, such as substance abuse, eating disorders, suicide, depression, and anxiety. Provide consultations and liaisons with all members of the college community, as needed.
