PURPOSE OF THE POSITION:

Provide psychological prevention, intervention, treatment, education and health promotion services, and support to the University community.

RESPONSIBILITIES & DUTIES:

Assessment, Counseling, Crisis Intervention, Clinical Consultation (65% of time):

- Conducts weekly intakes
- Provides short-term individual, couple, and group counseling to students presenting with developmental, psychiatric, and academic concerns
- Provides triage coverage and crisis intervention, including occasional after-hours crisis response
- Provides peer review and clinical consultation to other clinicians

Education & Outreach, Community Service, & Professional Development Activities (20% of time):

- Provides consultation to faculty, staff, and third-party stakeholders (e.g., responding to distressed students)
- Provides workshops and other educational outreach activities to the campus community
- Participates in campus-wide events and activities
- Accessible for community service activities appropriate to the profession
- Contributes to creative activities that enhance understanding and practice of psychology
- Maintains licensure through appropriate required continuing professional education

Administrative Responsibilities (15% of time):

- Attends all staff meetings, clinical team meetings, and other Divisional and University meetings as scheduled
- Maintains clinical records and completes administrative record-keeping in a timely manner
- May assist with oversight and coordination of clinical trainee program

Performs additional related duties as assigned.

SUPERVISOR/OTHER WORK RELATIONSHIPS:

Reports directly to the Director of Counseling and Psychological Services. Works closely with colleagues in Campus Life and the Division of Student Affairs. Works collaboratively with faculty, staff, and the campus community.

REQUIREMENTS OF POSITION:

Certificates, licenses, or education required:

- Doctorate in Clinical or Counseling Psychology (Ph.D. or Psy.D.) from a regionally accredited program

- Licensed as a Psychologist (in any state) and/or license eligible within six months
- Ability to be successfully credentialed by verification of training, experience, and licensure status

Additional knowledge, skills, and abilities required for this position:

- Experience conducting time-limited psychotherapy and crisis intervention
- Experience providing psychological assessment
- Ability to demonstrate awareness of the cultural diversity of the University community, and establish and maintain cooperative and effective relations with University employees, students, and the public
- Experience in providing cross-cultural counseling
- Experience providing clinical supervision and being part of a training program

Additional knowledge, skills, and abilities preferred for this position:

- Clinical experience in a college setting
- Licensed as a Psychologist
- Doctorate from APA-accredited program
- Internship at an APA-accredited site
- Experience in developing and providing outreach and education services to meet the mental health needs of college institutions
- Interest and demonstrated expertise in one of more concerns commonly presented by students desirable, including therapy with underserved populations, substance abuse, and eating disorders
- Experience using (or ability to quickly learn how to use) electronic medical records (EMR)
- Service in U.S. military
- Bilingual (Spanish)

Machines, tools, equipment, and motor vehicles used in the performance of the duties:

- Networked computer and printer, audio/video recording machines, copy machine, fax machine, and paper shredder.

Unique working conditions:

- Office operates as a member of team of student service units bound by shared vision, mission and goals. Providing on-campus, non-office bound services (i.e., workshops, special events, etc.) that may take place in Housing and Residential Education, Health Services, or other non-traditional settings. Occasional weekend and evening hours may be required.

A background check (including a criminal records check) must be completed satisfactorily before any candidate can be offered a position with the CSU. Failure to satisfactorily complete the background check may affect the application status of applicants or continued employment of current CSU employees who apply for the position.

The person holding this position is considered a 'mandated reporter' under the California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act and is required to comply with the requirements set forth in CSU Executive Order 1083, revised July 21, 2017, as a condition of employment.
