- · Maintain oversight and responsibility for CAPS budget.
- · Provide education and training opportunities and clinical supervision for staff and for students in accredited psychology, counseling, mental health counseling, or social work graduate programs.
- · Prepare Counseling Center's annual report, annual budget report, emergency response plan, and continuity of operations plan for the AVP of Health and Wellness in Student Affairs. Prepare CAPS strategic plan for the AVP to be in alignment with the University and division strategic goals.
