The Student Counseling Services (SCS) invites applications for two Staff Counselor/ Staff Psychologist positions, with a preferred start date of August 1, 2019. We seek professionals with well-developed therapy skills, strong interests in carrying a diverse and large clinical caseload, experience and interest in supervision and training of emerging psychologists, and a commitment to contribute to our outreach and prevention initiatives serving the larger campus community. #### **Required Qualifications**

Doctorate in Clinical Psychology or Counseling Psychology and license eligibility as an LCP required for at least one of the two open positions. The second position requires at least a master's degree in counseling, social work, psychology or a closely related field and eligibility for licensure as an LCSW, LCPC, LMFT or LCP.

#### **Desired Qualifications**

Strong preference will be given to licensed mental health providers and to applicants with college/university counseling center experience as well as experience providing clinical supervision.
