Counselor Psychologist, Generalist - Counseling Center

Job Summary

- The staff psychologist position is a generalist position housed in the Purdue University Northwest Counseling Center. The staff psychologist will be responsible for providing services to students and the University community by offering individual and group psychological counseling, consultation, outreach, and crisis intervention. There may also be some opportunities for couples' counseling.
- The generalist psychologist is skilled in fostering the academic progress and career development of University students through a variety of evidence-based interventions. The staff psychologist will participate in the Center's multidisciplinary treatment team, as well as the larger division of Student Affairs. The staff psychologist will also be involved in training the college's Residential Life staff and in other leadership trainings across campus and other duties as assigned. Maintains timely and thorough client contact documentation compliant with Center policies and procedures, FERPA, HIPAA guided and applicable state laws. Provides psycho-educational and holistic health outreach programs to students, faculty and staff in collaboration with the University Counseling Center's Outreach goals.
- Affiliation with professional organizations, and/or presentations at national and regional conferences is desirable.

Education

Doctoral degree in Counseling Psychology or Clinical Psychology from an American Psychological Association (APA) accredited program. Early career psychologist (licensure within 12 months) or licensed/licensed-ready as a (HSPP) *health service provider psychology* to practice psychology in the State of Indiana with qualification for providing clinical supervision. Qualified candidates will be in the process of becoming a licensed psychologist who is able to practice independently and supervise (HSPP status) involving the following requirements: A completed Ph.D. or Psy.D. degree awarded from an APA accredited doctoral psychology program.

Experience

Doctoral study program accounts for years of experience. Total experience should equal 5 years.

Preferred: Well-developed counseling skills, a demonstrated collaborative work history that reflects acceptance and respect. Flexibility in managing professional tasks, commitment to professionalism, a demonstrated commitment to multicultural competency, and excellent oral and written communication skills are essential to success in this position. Previous training and experience in a college or university counseling center is highly desirable. Previous training and experience in the area of substance abuse.
