Position Summary	<p>The Clinical Director oversees the Student Counseling Center's (SCC) day to day administrative operation, clinical services, and reports to the Chairperson of Department of Counseling and Development and the Dean of the College of Education. Clinical staff in the SCC are members of the faculty. Currently there are 5 full time faculty (including the clinical director) in the SCC. The Clinical Director is responsible for recommending to the Chair/Dean such matters as personnel actions, policy and procedure changes, and the Student Counseling Center budget. Opportunity to teach a course once or twice a year in the Department of Counseling and Development's graduate counseling programs may be assigned by the Department Chair. Faculty rank at hiring will be determined commensurate with qualifications and experience of the successful candidate. The Clinical Director of the Student Counseling Center ensures the psychological and well-being needs of SRU students are effectively met. It is a 9-month full-time, tenure-track faculty position (with possibility of summer contract) with primary assignment outside of the classroom. A portion of the Director's</p>

	<p>hours are assigned to provide professional counseling services to students with personal, social, interpersonal, and educational issues including. intake assessment, individual, group, and couples/family therapy. Provides, along with other Center counselors, crisis intervention for psychological emergencies. Provides consultation, education, and referral regarding psychological issues to students, faculty, and staff. Facilitates psychiatric hospitalization for students as necessary. Consults with graduate counselors-in-training completing practicum/internship experiences. Provides psycho-educational outreach programs for students, staff, and faculty. Serves on university and department committees completing tasks as assigned. Engages in scholarly activities commensurate with faculty appointment.</p>
