- demonstrated experience in crisis intervention and consultation, and;
- demonstrated experience in providing outreach to campus communities.

- one year, full-time equivalent, APA approved internship in a college counseling center;
- licensed as a psychologist in New York State;
- recent experience working in a college counseling center;

- expertise in providing clinical supervision or expertise in one of the following areas: eating disorders, mental health administration, counseling multicultural and diverse populations, or sexual assault trauma;
- experience working closely with individuals from under-represented minority (URM) and other under-represented identity groups;
- experience in providing outreach to traditionally under-served and vulnerable populations; experience in assessment, computer literacy or data analysis
