Staff Psychologist/Counselor with Trauma Specialization

Essential Functions: Mental Health Services within the Habif Health and Wellness Center at Washington University in St. Louis invites applications for a newly approved position as a clinical staff member with strong generalist skills in the areas of time-limited individual, couples, and group counseling, outreach/consultation, and crisis intervention. The successful candidate should be trained and experienced in the current best practices for trauma-informed treatment of PTSD and acute traumatic stress for providing both time-limited and ongoing individual therapy. Clinical expertise should be substantial in the treatment of various traumas including sexual trauma, interpersonal violence, and trauma related to chronic, historical, and systematic marginalization. This clinician will support the center's professional development focused on the various forms of trauma and its differential impact on individuals and communities.

Required Qualifications: A doctorate in a mental health related field from an APA accredited program and completion of an APA approved internship or an LCSW/LPC/LMFT and 5 years of experience. A license or license eligibility in the State of Missouri is also necessary.

Preferred Qualifications: Preference will be given to seasoned candidates with: 1) a proven track record working in a university counseling center setting with service to undergraduate, graduate, and professional students, 2) licensure as a psychologist, 3) Linehan-certified in Dialectical Behavioral Therapy, 4) demonstrated experience/commitment working with diverse individuals and communities from varying sexual orientations, gender identities, and ethnically, racially, and internationally diverse backgrounds, 5) well-developed clinical skills including an interest and demonstrated experience with the provision of various types of group therapy, 6) demonstrated ability to handle spontaneous work demands while undertaking projects that require advanced planning, 7) a collaborative spirit and ability to work effectively with a multidisciplinary staff of health and mental health professionals, 8) excellent oral and written communication skills, and 9) a familiarity or interest in learning about the use of technology in the delivery of mental health interventions.

Position: Full time, 12-month position. Anticipated starting date of January 2019. Salary is commensurate with experience and includes an excellent benefits package. For full-consideration, candidates should submit their application materials no later than October 12. Decision-making will begin in mid-October and continue until the position is filled.
