Possession of strong clinical skills and the ability to manage a full client caseload are required, as well as a demonstrated commitment to working effectively from a multicultural orientation with a diverse college population, proficiency providing campus outreach presentations, and the ability to work collaboratively in a multidisciplinary team. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to participate in the clinical supervision and training of master's level graduate students and doctoral psychology interns. Clinicians with the capability to conduct therapy in a second language and who have expertise working with clients on the autism spectrum, disordered eating, substance use concerns, and sexual difficulties are highly encouraged to apply. Opportunities for participating in innovative counseling outcome research and future adjunct teaching may be available.

The UCC is accredited by the International Association of Counseling Services (IACS). Our staff is composed of professionals from psychology, social work, clinical mental health, and psychiatric nursing backgrounds. We have a several nationally recognized training programs, including a doctoral psychology internship accredited by the American Psychological Association, a master's internship in Social Work, and practica in Counseling Psychology, Clinical Psychology, and Social Work.
